Reminders:

- The doors to the school open at 7:30 for breakfast and the weather is beginning to become colder. Please do not drop your children off prior to 7:30.
- As the weather becomes colder, please send your children with appropriate clothing. The following guidelines are listed in the Parent/Student handbook:
 - 60°F or above: short sleeves and shorts are acceptable.
 - 50°F-59°F: long sleeves and pants are necessary.
 - 49°F-40°F: coats or sweatshirts are recommended.
 - 39°F or below: snow pants, boots, winter coats, and gloves are necessary to play and walk on the snow. Otherwise, students will stay on hard, snowless surfaces.
- Please do not park in the no parking area near the crosswalk in front of the school.
